

KEEP YOUR COMMUNITY FIRE SAFE

The major causes of fire in an apartment are highlighted below. Please avoid these activities to keep your home and community safe.



CARELESS SMOKING

Smoking and throwing lit cigarette butts from balconies or in common areas can cause a fire.



MATCHES AND INCENSE STICKS

Unattended or careless use of matches, candles and incense sticks in your home can start a fire.



BARBECUING ON BALCONIES

This method of cooking within your property is against the Community Rules and can cause a fire.



UNATTENDED COOKING

Pay close attention when cooking and remember to turn off the cooker when you leave home.



FIRE HAZARDOUS ITEMS

Identify and remove fire hazards in your home. There should be at least three feet distance between heating items and any flammable substances.



FAULTY SMOKE DETECTORS

Allow the building maintenance team to check the condition of your smoke detectors regularly. Do not block or cover the detectors.



STORING ITEMS ON BALCONIES

Avoid storing wooden/cardboard cartons, plastic boxes, garbage bags, or other types of flammable material or liquids, as this could fuel a fire.



BLOCKING EMERGENCY EXITS

Do not obstruct the fire hydrant cabinets or emergency exits placed along corridors and parking levels with personal belongings.



ELECTRICAL MODIFICATIONS & DEVICES

Making any electrical modifications, such as installing halogen downlights with unrated transformers can cause heat-related fires. Do not overload power outlets or leave electronic items plugged into sockets after use.
